## Part B: Review of outcomes in the previous academic year

#### PDG outcomes

This details the impact that our PDG activity had on pupils in the 2023 to 2024 academic year.

The PDG grant was used on resources to enrich the pupils' provision. More welfare resources were bought to add to the school's 'cornel clud', such as feelings games, feeling stones, a writing board and more books that discuss different issues and feelings. When looking at the results of our well-being questionnaires, the majority of our pupils are aware of the school's processes and where they can go if they feel uncomfortable about something. The staff are much more aware of the Curriculum and have attended a number of courses and visited and discussed with other schools about their plans to create new outside areas.
